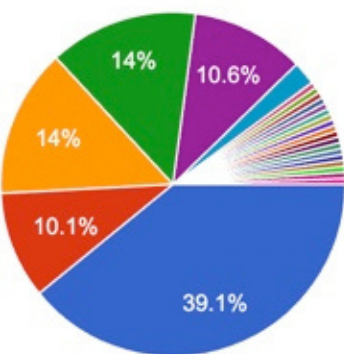

I am proud to see patients that couldn't walk due to fractures get up and begin moving around and continue to live their life after an operation performed by the orthopedic team."
